If you attended or watched our Aug. 3 worship, you heard the good news that Bright Tsevi is getting married this month. Bright will move to northern Virginia next month to be with his bride, Sylvia. We wish both of them the best and we appreciate and will very much miss Bright's ministry.

Bright's leaving creates an opportunity for us: We need volunteers to facilitate livestreaming of worship services. It's not been easy to find volunteers on Sundays when Bright's been away, and now that we know that he will not be with us Aug. 24 and that his final Sunday here is Aug. 31, we have time to plan.

Who would like to sign up to assist with this ministry? It's not difficult; as you may have noticed, I've learned how to do this with no formal instruction, and if I'm up to the task, so is anyone who's ever used a computer or smart phone – and I've only had a smart phone for the last two years. Here's what I suggest:

First, let's get multiple volunteers to assist so this responsibility no longer falls to one person. I plan to create a sign-up sheet and to ask for two volunteers each week – one to move the camera and one to stream the service from the laptop in the sanctuary. I can show you how to do either, and I feel sure that Bright would do the same.

Please look for a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board across from the office, and please consider signing up and encouraging others to do. This ministry is open to all ages, for as our Epistle for Sunday, Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16, reminds us, no one is too old to serve God.
