Club	Love is to the heart what the summer is to the farmer's year," said evangelist Billy Graham. "It brings to harvest all the loveliest flowers of the soul." Without summer, our gardens would disappoint, and without love, our hearts wouldn't bloom. The warmth of summer and love aren't the only ingredients required for abundant physical and spiritual crops, however. Discernment and persistence ensure fruitful yields in both areas. "Unless we know the difference between flowers and weeds, we are not fit to take care of a
	and weeds, we are not fit to take care of a garden," advised Clyde Francis Lytle. "It is not enough to have truth planted in our minds. We must learn and labor to keep the ground clear of thorns and briars, follies and perversities, which have a wicked propensity to choke the word of life."



I preached on Luke 8:26-39 on Sunday, June 22, when I was in Groton, Conn. I told the congregation at the Chapel on the Thames that the boat trip described in the chapter may have made the disciples defensive.

The trip actually begins in v. 22, which reads, "One day Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let's go over to the other side of the lake." I said that the other side of the lake was enemy territory for Jews, which is why the disciples may have felt defensive.

Jesus falls asleep during the transit, even though a storm strikes. The disciples wake Jesus, screaming that they're about to drown. Jesus calms the storm and the disciples ask themselves, "Who is this? He commands the winds and the water, and they obey him."

I said that since the disciples learned that Jesus commands the winds and the water, perhaps they learned that it was time to go into enemy territory as well.

This may have been the reason I decided to change "Sermon" in the bulletin to "Lesson." I hope this shows that worship is a time where we learn together. The change may seem esoteric, but I hope that it also reflects that we're all participants in worship and that there's only one spectator in worship and that's God.

On the subject of our all being participants in worship, let me ask again for volunteers to assist with the Facebook livestream of worship services. Assisting is easy; I pretty much learned how to do it just from the written instructions I found. I would love for us to have a rotation of volunteers to help with livestreaming so that the responsibility doesn't fall on one person's shoulders and so that we all get to enjoy being in worship while occasionally helping with Facebook.

Please help Oaklette glorify God with such participation.
