Why do you come to church? Why do you come to Oaklette?

The reason I come to church is to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. I hope that's the reason that you come to church, too. I've been thinking in terms of having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as I prepare to speak on Revelation 7:9-17 on May 11.

I'm about to turn 63, and as you may have heard me say, Bishop Will Willimon wrote in *Don't Look Back* three years ago that the median age in the United Methodist Church is 63. He also wrote that any institution whose median age is 63 is automatically in decline. I wonder if our median age reflects how well we help people form personal relationships with Jesus Christ.

I really didn't have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ until I was past 30. I joined Baylake UMC a few years before then – around the time I was 27 or 28 – but I didn't really begin to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ until I heard these words: "We are all the beloved children of Jesus Christ whether we think about it or not." I heard that not at Baylake but at the chapel at Little Creek, where I returned for a visit one day in 1994, when I was 32. In the next two years or so at Little Creek, I came to see Jesus Christ as the one through whom I can ask forgiveness from God. It's

that relationship that keeps me coming to church, and I wonder if one of the challenges I hope that challenge is addressed in the new United Methodist Church mission statement that reads, "The United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in local communities and worldwide connections." I like the phrase "forms disciples" because, to me, that implies helping one another form relationships with Jesus Christ. I think that we form such relationships when we love and serve and lead in local communities and through worldwide connections, all of which is empowered by the Holy Spirit, as our new mission statement says.

for the church is doing better in helping people have personal relationships with Jesus Christ.
