As often as I've cited statistics from the Possibilities Report Oaklette received in 2022, I was surprised Monday by one I had not noticed. Oaklette's average Sunday school attendance in 2008 was 130. By 2018, it was down to 45, and by 2020 and 2021, during and after COVID, that number was less than 30. I've had conversations with church members recently in which I've heard that there were once many children at Oaklette and that those children moved away when they went to grew up and got jobs. This may explain part of the decline in worship and Sunday school attendance at Oaklette in the last 15 to 20 years. The question remains: What do we do about this trajectory?

I'd like to suggest a two-fold response, starting with renewed focus on God's word. This is why I've mentioned starting a Sunday evening Bible study and also why I'm thinking of starting another Sunday school class. I've asked a couple of folks who do not attend Sunday school now if they'd be interested in a study of Adam Hamilton's Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith starting next month. That decision is pending.

A decision was made Tuesday to start offering "The Beverly Hillbillies Bible Study" in January. This decision came from the committee on nominations and lay leadership development after a discussion of educational opportunities at an Aug. 26 meeting. I shared with the committee that I have two fourweek Bible study lessons based on "The Beverly Hillbillies" from my days on the Eastern Shore. I plan to offer the study in-person and via Zoom with everyone watching episodes of the show together on YouTube. We've got plenty of time to plan and a busy fall pending [see the P.S. below], so we'll work out the schedule together.

Since I'm retiring from the naval reserves Jan. 1, I'll have more time free for studies. I'm hoping lessons such as these lead us into the second response I'd like to suggest: community involvement.
