It may have been "Why Do the Innocent Suffer?" the title of chapter six in Adam Hamilton's *Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith*, that convinced me to offer the text as a Sunday-evening study. I asked about starting a fall study months ago, something in the same time slot as Oaklette's former Mayberry study. A couple of folks have said things that chapter six of Hamilton's study may address, so I sounded them out and came up with a plan, namely to begin this study, in person and on Zoom, Sundays at 6:30 p.m. starting Oct. 5. The study continues through Nov. 23 and won't meet Oct. 19 or Nov. 16, which are my last two weekends with the reserves since I retire from the Navy Jan. 1. Here's a schedule for the class:

Oct. 5, chapter one: Is There a God?

Oct. 12, chapter two: The Good Book? Wrestling with the Bible

Oct. 26, chapter three: Are All Non-Christians Going to Hell?

Nov. 2, chapter four: Is Heaven Real?

Nov. 9, chapter five: When Prayers Go Unanswered

Nov. 23, chapter six: Why Do the Innocent Suffer?

Copies of the text will cost about \$16. We'll place the order by Monday, Sept. 22, so please let the office know by then if you'd like a copy. We plan to pass them out on Sunday, Sept. 28.

As this study progresses, we'll discuss having an Advent study in the same time slot starting Sunday, Nov. 30. We'll also come up with a plan for a "Beverly Hillbillies" Bible study starting in January, and we'll discuss how all of these studies may differ from any offered in the past. Again, all of these classes will be offered in person and via Zoom.
